Ian graduated from Marist in 2006. In 2010, he received a BS in Health Physics from Purdue University and in 2018 received a MBA from Loyola University. Since graduating from Purdue and for the past 8 years, Ian has worked for the Department of Energy's Argonne National Laboratory in the health physics department. Health physics is the practice of applied physics for purposes of radiation protection (helping people work with radiation safely). Ian provides health physics support for Argonne's particle accelerators including the Advanced Photon Source to produce synchrotron radiation, a heavy ion accelerator to study nuclear physics, and an electron accelerator for the production of medical radiopharmaceuticals.
