**Current tuition is  
\$13,750 (2022-2023)**

- **Registration fee is \$400**
- **Marist High School does not charge any fees for Athletics, Fundraising, Student Activities**
- **Payments are divided into 10 payments starting in July and ending in April**
- **Marist will work with families to create flexible payment arrangements**

# FACTS Grant Aid Assessment



- Marist uses FACTS Grant Aid Assessment to help us organize and analyze family financial assistance applications
- FACTS does not provide any financial assistance they only analyze family data
- Families pay \$30 to FACTS as an application fee

# Important Details

- **MOST IMPORTANT!** – Please submit the application for Financial Assistance on time!
  - Include the first 2 pages of your 2021 1040 tax return form if 2022 is not yet complete
  - Include your 2022 W-2 forms
- Families with siblings currently attending Marist need only to submit one application

# Financial Assistance



- Awards range from \$800 to about \$2,900 per year
- Average Financial Assistance Award \$1,900
- Currently over 28% of our students receive financial assistance
- Most families will qualify for some assistance

# Important Dates for incoming freshmen (Class of 2026)

- October 31, 2022– FACTS begins accepting financial assistance applications for 2023-2024 school year
- December 3, 2022 – Entrance exam
- February 1, 2023 – Acceptance letters mailed on or before this date
- February 15, 2023 - Financial Assistance deadline for all families with an incoming Freshmen



# Important Dates for Incoming Freshmen (Continued)

- **March 8, 2023 – Incoming Freshmen notified of financial assistance awards. An email will be sent to families by Marist through FACTS**
- **March 24, 2023 - \$400 Registration fee is due**
- **June 15, 2023 - \$500 Deposit due to release Freshman schedule in July (deposit applied to tuition)**



# Important Dates for Returning Students

- Must I reapply each year?
  - Yes, all families must reapply and generally will receive the same amount (or more) of assistance as the previous year
- April 20, 2023 – Financial Assistance applications deadline for returning students
- May 31, 2023 – Current/Returning Students notified of Financial Assistance Award. An email will be sent to families by Marist through FACTS







# Discounts

- A \$300 Early Payment Credit is given for families who pay tuition in full By July 20<sup>th</sup>
- \$1,000 sibling discount for 2<sup>nd</sup> student
- \$2,000 sibling discount for 3<sup>rd</sup> student
- \$\$\$\$ TBD discount for 4<sup>th</sup> student



# Academic Scholarships For Freshmen



- RedHawk Scholarship \$4,000 per year
  - Based on score of 95+ on entrance exam
- Champagnat Scholarship \$2,000 per year
  - Based on score of 90 to 94 on entrance exam
- Brothers Scholarship \$1,000 per year
  - Based on score of 85 to 89 on entrance exam
- All renew automatically with “B” average



# Work Study



- Marist has over 200 students participating in our work study program
  - Lunch Work Study
    - 5 to 10 minutes commitment per day
  - Before or After School Work Study
    - 30 to 50 minutes a few day per week
    - Flexible with athletes/club schedules
- Credit earned each month is applied directly towards the student's tuition

Most of these outside scholarships have deadlines in the fall of the students 8<sup>th</sup> grade academic year. Some applications open in spring of 7<sup>th</sup> grade academic year.

# Outside Scholarship Opportunities

- **Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program**
  - Beginning January 2023 families will be able to apply through Scholarship Granting Organizations (SGO), Operated by the Illinois Department of Revenue.
  - Families are encouraged to apply to multiple SGO/TCS applications

# Outside Scholarship Opportunities (Continued)

- Two Organizations to apply with are:
  - Big Shoulders Fund SGO/TCS – TBD
  - Empower Illinois – TBD
- Please note that Marist has worked with Big Shoulders Fund SGO/TCS for applications, however it is recommended to apply to all SGO/TCSs who have applications
- Because this is a fund based scholarship, families may qualify but are only awarded if there are funds. Marist does not have control over who is awarded
