

Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program Year 6 2023/2024 Academic Year

Program Overview

- Illinois Invest in Kids Act, provides donors a unique opportunity to contribute to scholarships that help low-income families send their children to private schools while reducing their own tax bill on dollars otherwise owed to the state.
- Funds are awarded to students at nonpublic schools from low income households in Illinois, paying up to 100% of the tuition and eligible fees.



- Donors can receive a 75% state tax credit.
- A \$1,000 donation can give a donor \$750 back on their state taxes.

Who we're working with

- Big Shoulders Fund
 - The Big Shoulders Fund is an approved Scholarship
 Granting Organization (SGO) and the only SGO to successfully launch its application three years in a row.
 - They have been praised for their customer service and family focus.

When to Apply

- JANUARY 12, 2023 at 8:00am!
- Applications are considered, and awards are made based on the order in which eligible applications are received – first-come, first-served.
 - *Mobile friendly application* (recommended method)
 - <u>Google Chrome</u> (recommended browser)
- Former recipients must re-apply each year.






Important Definitions

- Household Size: An individual or group of individuals living together in a room or group of rooms in a housing unit.
- Include those living with family part-time but still financially supported, i.e. college student
- Adjusted Gross Income: Adjusted gross income (AGI) is a measure of income calculated from your gross income and used to determine how much of your income is taxable.
- Pages one and two of the Federal form 1040 is needed to see the number of household members (dependents) and AGI
- Applicants must provide income of all household members, including college students, grandparents, or other adults





Eligibility

Eligibility is largely determined by household income:

Two Step Application Process

- Step 1: Online application
 - Include all household and student information.
 - You will need to know your Adjusted Gross Income, but will not need to provide proof of income.
- You will receive your date-time stamp after completing the first Eligibility Screen

 but you MUST CONTINUE on with the full 5 page application to save your datetime stamp.



Two Step Application Process

- Step 2: Submission of Documents
 - After January 13th, Big Shoulders will reach out to a limited number of applicants, via email, based on datetime stamp and anticipated funding for each school, and request applicants to complete Step 2 of the process by submitting documentation verifying income and residence.
 - Applicants will have 10 DAYS to submit required information or the application will be denied.
 - As additional funding is received through the calendar year, Big Shoulders will continue to reach out to applicants to complete Step 2.
 - **Completion of Step 2 is not a guarantee of a scholarship and due to limited funding for this program, not all applicants will be asked to complete Step 2 of the application.**







- Priority Status = all of the below applying and submitting proof of income and residence before 4/1
- Eligible student who received a tax credit scholarship from ANY SGO during the previous school year
- Eligible students who are siblings of a student that is a current Tax Credit Scholar
- Eligible students whose household income does not exceed 185% of the federal poverty level
- Eligible students who reside within a focus school district (i.e. everyone in the Chicago Public School district)

Gather and scan prior to the application day!



Documents Needed When Step 2 is Requested

- Proof of income & household number
 - Federal 1040(s) for all members of the Household (pages 1 & 2) must show AGI on line 7 or 8 and list all household members/dependents.
 - OR if not filing taxes verified sworn statement* signed by all adult household members with proof of their income (W-2s, year-end pay stubs, proof of government benefits, etc.)
- Proof of address one of the following
 - ID
 - Utility bill
 - Lease / Deed

Marist Financial Assistance

- Because we are unsure how many new families will receive the Tax Credit Scholarship, we ask that families still apply each year for Marist Financial Assistance through FACTS.
- Receipt of a Tax Credit Scholarship does not exclude a family from the possibility of receiving Marist Financial Assistance or Named Scholarships.
 - However, families who are recipients of a Tax Credit Scholarship will be subject to review and adjustments of Marist Financial Assistance.

Deadlines

- Incoming Freshmen FACTS applications are due February 15, 2023.
- Returning Students FACTS applications are due April 18, 2023.

Marist Financial Assistance (Cont.)



- All families must reapply and generally will receive the same amount (or more) of assistance as the previous year.
- Awards range from \$800 to about \$2,800 per year.
 - Average award being around \$1,800
- Most families will qualify for some assistance.
